



SGT Albert B. Marzano, U.S. Marine Corps Vietnam

Sgt. Albert B. Marzano served as a 0311 rifleman in DaNang, GoNoi Island and in Operation Allen Brook, Vietnam from January 6, 1969 through September 14, 1969.

While in combat on June 27, 1969 at GoNoi Island, Sgt. Marzano came under direct attack by rocket propelled grenades. Many of his military brothers were killed and Sgt Marzano suffered severe shrapnel wounds. As a result of his injuries, Marzano received the Purple Heart. He was discharged with honor on July 3, 1972.

Marzano also received 2 Good Conduct Medals, National Defense Service Medal, Combat Action Ribbons, Vietnam Campaign Medal, the RVB MUC CAC 1st Class, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry Medal with Palms and the Vietnam Service Medal.

Mr. Marzano lives in Greenville, PA. He is the father of Sgt. Michael Marzano, U.S. Marines 3rd Battalion, killed in action on May 7, 2005 at Hadithah, Iraq. The younger Marzano was 28 years old and was a past Mercer Memorial 500 Honoree.

Sgt Albert Marzano is the son of Joseph and Ida Marzano, both deceased, and the brother of Joseph Marzano, FL, and two sisters Pat Sorber, TX and Sally Homer, Greenville, PA
